Darjeeling Tea

- Known as the "Champagne" of teas, Darjeeling tea, from the Darjeeling region in West Bengal, India, has traditionally been prized above all other black teas.
- When properly brewed it yields a thin-bodied, light-colored liquor with a floral aroma. The flavor also displays a tinge of astringent tannic characteristics, and a musky spiciness often referred to by tea connoisseurs as "muscatel."
- A sweet cooling aftertaste should be felt in the mouth.



Flavors of Darjeeling Tea

- The flavors of Darjeeling Tea differ from season to season. According to the plucking period, the seasons can be categorized as under: -
- Easter Flush (March April):
 It arrives just after the dormant Winter months. The leaves are tender and very light green in appearance. The liquor too is light, clear, bright and imparts a pleasant brisk flavor
- Spring Flush (May June):
 This flush is famed for its prominent quality. The leaf has a purplish bloom. The liquor is more round, mellow and with more color (amber) and has a slightly fruity flavor. It is during this period that the famous "Muscatel" flavor becomes pronounced.
- Summer Flush (July September):
 During this period the nature of the liquor changes, becoming stronger, yet retaining the brightness and character that Darjeeling is known for.
- Autumn Flush (October November):
 The Tea during this period has a light coppery tinge and liquors have a delicate character.
- Winter Months (December February) : Dormant period with no production.



The Darjeeling Logo

- The Darjeeling Logo is a property of The Tea Board of India. It was launched in 1983. It is a symbol that verifies that the packet / caddy etc contains 100 % pure Darjeeling, unblended with teas from any other growth.
- There are certain procedures prescribed by the Tea Board of India to be complied with to get permission for the printing of the logo on a product. If you are interested in knowing more, please email us.



Making of a cup of Darjeeling Tea

- Take 1 level teaspoon of pure Darjeeling Tea in each cup. Nothing for the pot. Pour water, immediately after bringing it to a furious boil. Brew it for 3 - 4 minutes. A perfect cup of Darjeeling is ready.
- If Broken / Fanning Grades of tea is used, ½
 teaspoon of tea would suffice. In case milk or
 sugar is to be added then the brewing time has
 to extend to about 5 minutes.
- The quantity of Tea and the brewing time can be altered according to personal preferences.
- Iced tea is also popular, with a slice of lemon.



Point of Sale check before buying a packet of Darjeeling Tea

 The packet must have a Darjeeling Tea Logo. "Darjeeling" or "Pure Darjeeling" or "100% Darjeeling" - must be mentioned.



Assam Tea

- Black Tea
- Black tea is fully fermented, and gains its color and character from the processing of the leaves.
 Once picked, the leaves undergo a series of five steps, called the "Fermentation Process".
- The leaves range in color from brown to black, often with golden or silver tips. The bright copper liquor has a full, round aroma, and a flavor ranging from malty to flowery. This is the only type of tea that can be taken with milk and sugar.



Assam Tea

- Oolong Tea
- Oolong is a semi-fermented tea. It undergoes the same treatment as black tea, but instead of rolling the entire leaf, only the edges of each leaf are rubbed. The result is that only the cells at the edges of the leaves are disrupted and will ferment. Additionally, oolong teas are fermented for less time than black teas.



Assam Tea

- Green Tea
- Green tea is unfermented. After the leaves are picked, they are immediately pan-fired or steamed to prevent any oxidation. They are then rolled, dried and sorted. Green tea has a more subtle, delicate flavor, and far less caffeine than fermented tea. It is said to be medicinally beneficial, because the unfermented leaves retain a higher concentration of natural vitamins and polyphenols than their fermented counterparts. Green tea contains minerals (iron, sodium, potassium) and an assortment of vitamins (carotene, A, D, B1, B2, C).



Dooars Tea

We also offer our customers with **Dooars Black Tea** that comes from the Dooars region of North India, which is a blend of rich color and excellent taste. This black tea, made from the Camellia Sinensis plant, undergoes greater oxidation and fermentation when they are processed, hence, imparting the great herbal taste to it. This variety of black tea is appreciated for having a strong taste and rich aroma better than most of the other leaves. Our Dooars black tea is known for being long lasting, as they retain flavor even after a number of years, owing to which, these are very popular and in demand in the international markets. Grown in Assam and Darjeeling, this variety of tea can be prepared with or without milk and also with masala. As, it benefits health, black tea is preferred over coffee in some countries. Moreover, among all the tea beverage drinkers, the three-fourth population drinks this tea. It is the most popular variety of tea in the western nations today.



Nilgiris Tea

 Nilgiri tea is generally described as being a dark, intensely aromatic, fragrant and flavourful tea grown in the southern portion of the Western Ghats mountains of Southern India. It is grown in the hills of the Nilgiris district of Tamil Nadu, though there are numerous other tea districts in South India as well, including Munnar and Central Travancore, further south in Kerala state.



Nilgiris Tea

- The expensive hand-sorted, full-leaf versions of the tea like the <u>Orange Pekoe</u> (O.P.) are highly sought after at international auctions. The strong flavours of Nilgiri tea make it useful for blending purposes.
- A machine-sorted, lower-cost variety of high quality tea is a semi-full leaf variety known as <u>Broken Orange</u> <u>Pekoe</u> (B.O.P.). However, most production occurs via the <u>Crush</u>, <u>Tear</u>, <u>Curl</u> or CTC process of manufacture, which delivers a higher number of cups per measure (technically known as *cuppage*).
- In November 2006 a Nilgiri Tea achieved "Top Honours" and fetched a world record price of \$600 per kg. This was at the first ever tea auction held in Las Vegas.
